Louis Lenz Inventory # 18 of 71; another large granite monument similar to homesite, a plate approx. 20" x 24" removed, "There is nothing on it to indicate who placed it there."; location of the red granite stone not known, David Pomeroy believes that it may have been lost to subsidence. Pomeroy notes that this marker was erected by the Texas Historical and Landmarks Association, founded by Adnia deZavala in San Antonio
