**Directions:** Zavala Point, across Buffalo Bayou from the Battleship Texas; West bound on I-10, exit 783, Sheldon Road, turn right on Sheldon, .4 miles to 1st stop light turn left on Market St., .1 mile turn right on DeZavala; 1 mile from Market turn right, no street sign, continue 1 mile, power lines run along left sided of road, concludes at Cemex plant gate, ask attendant to access marker area near bayou
